Ohio Rallies to Save Middle Class Jobs

Over 20,000 workers, community and faith leaders, and students converged on the Ohio Statehouse in Columbus on Tuesday, March 1, for a Rally to Save Ohio's Middle Class. The massive rally came in response to Governor Kasick's anti-worker agenda and recently proposed Senate Bill 5.

Leading up to today's rally, the offices of Ohio Senate Republicans have been flooded all week, according to news reports. One office reported receiving more than 10,000, some from as far as Scotland and Germany, and are running about 90% opposed according to one aide. Actor Danny Glover Joins Workers in Indiana

Actor and activist Danny Glover addressed a crowd of more than 1,000 supporters at a rally for Indiana's working families on Monday, February 28th in Indianapolis.

"We have to tell those who we bring to office that we did not bring you to office so you can balance the budget on our back," he said in his address.



House Democrats remain absent from the Capitol, denying quorum on HB 1468. UFCW members from Locals 700, 881, 75, 1546, and 227 have been out in force alongside other opponents of the bill who continue to swarm the halls of the state capitol.

"I am feeling so empowered by these workers out here standing up for what is right, standing up for their rights, standing up for their communities, and for other workers in the country," said Glover. "I hope they accomplish what they have set out to. And that is a voice. That is to defeat these Draconian laws."

Missouri Members Lobby gainst Right to Work

On February 23, UFCW Local 655, Local 2, and Local 88 members met with House and Senate members in Jefferson City, Mo., about the four right to work bills introduced in the legislature. Over 120 UFCW members attended the Lobby Day to delivery their message to Missouri politicians: end the assault on workers and start working on real solutions for rebuilding our middle class.



Following the Lobby Day, hundreds of concerned Missouri workers and community members gathered at the Capitol for a rally to Save the American Dream on Saturday, February 26.
