

# **Associates Challenge Walmart on Executive Pay**

Four Walmart associates have introduced a shareholders resolution to place tougher standards on the company's executive bonus pay. News of the resolution came at the same time the company disclosed CEO Mike Duke's pay was \$18.1 million in 2011.

Walmart's current bonus structure gives management incentive to keep building new stores near existing stores, which drives down same-store sales, one of the most important indicators of health for a retail company. The resolution being offered by associates would require an annual review of incentives to determine if they are actually effective or hurting the company.

#### Walmart has a plan to battle Target, Dollarma in Canada
